

EVENT DESCRIPTION

The **STUDY-FREE FUN ZONE** is designed to offer customers a chance to blow off some steam with fun games they can play with their friends. This is intended to be a quick event held intermittently between study sessions.



In addition to highlighting your featured **CRAM JAM** menu selections, you may also want to consider a menu of bite-sized, shareable appetizers for your special **STUDY-FREE FUN ZONE** event.



This entire event can be held on a single evening or it can be extended over a number of days throughout your **CRAM JAM** promotion.









ENHANCEMENTS

MUSIC/ENTERTAINMENT

Ask an amateur campus DJ, a personality from your campus radio station, a Campus Intern or staff member to host the event and play appropriate themed music.*

* Be sure to check on the legal requirements regarding the playing of copyrighted music in public.

DÉCOR

To help you make your **CRAM JAM** event a huge success, we recommend securing a cornhole/bean bag toss game, ping pong table or ring toss — anything that gets students to unwind while keeping them active.

STEP-BY-STEP

GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS

To host your **STUDY-FREE FUN ZONE** event, you'll need the following items:

- Cornhole/Bean Bag Toss

- Ring Toss

- Ping Pong Tables/Balls

- Hula Hoops
- Determine how much space your games will require and set aside an appropriately-sized section of your dining hall. Make sure the area that you choose does not interfere with your serving line or other high traffic areas in your dining area.
- Have staff members or Campus Interns stationed at each game to award prizes to winning participants.

GAME DETAILS

- ULTIMATE CORNHOLE Have a bean bag board set up and challenge customers to see if they can get all three bean bags through the hole. Have a staff member give small prizes to those who accomplish the feat.
- HULA HOOP CHALLENGE Invite your customers to hula hoop as many times as they can in a row. Have a staff member on hand to record the highest scores throughout the event. At the end of the event, declare the ultimate hula winner and award an appropriate prize.
- PING PONG Set up a ping pong table, encouraging students to enter a tournament-style game in which the winners from each round go on to compete for one grand prize.
- RING TOSS Have participants try to get three rings around a bottle of a popular soft drink you serve on campus. Award a beverage/snack pack with items from the participating supplier to whomever completes the task.

PROCESS

- 1. Staff members (or event volunteers) should be at each station regulating the games and giving away prizes.
- 2. For games like the Hula Hoop Challenge that require a number of contestants who will participate throughout the day, make sure a staff member records the high scoring participants information to get in touch with the winner.
- 3. You may want to have a variety of other games and activities like brain teasers, puzzles and playing cards available for customers to enjoy on their own or with friends separate from the prize competitions.
